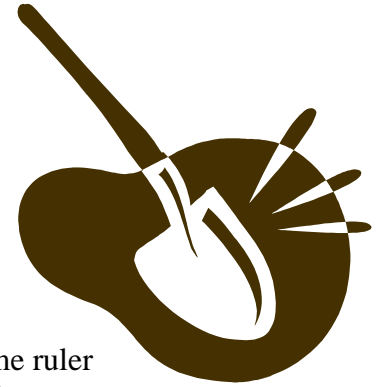


Digging Deeper

BIBLE STUDY

1. Psalm 75:1 declares the personal and intimate nature of our relationship with God (“Your Name is near”). What do the following verses tell us about God’s desire to maintain that close relationship with us?
 - Psalm 23:4
 - Matthew 18:20
 - Matthew 28:20
2. How does God’s statement in Psalm 75:2 respond to the concerns of the Psalmist in Psalm 74:10-11?
 - In what ways should this affect us when we grow frustrated by God’s apparent silence when we are in the midst of adversity?
3. Read Psalm 75:8. Pastor Paul said on Sunday that our society doesn’t really like to talk about “the wrath of God”. Do you agree? If so, why do you think there is such reluctance?
4. What do the following verses teach about the consequences for sin?
 - Isaiah 3:11
 - Hosea 4:6-9
 - Romans 6:23
 - Galatians 6:7
